## HISTORY OF THE SOCIETY

In 1984, at a meeting of the Heraldry Society, it was mentioned to John Brooke-Little, then Norroy and Ulster King of Arms, that it would be appropriate to found a Society of Friends of the College of Arms. Norroy and Ulster explained that the late Wilfrid Scott-Giles, Fitzalan Pursuivant Extraordinary, had mooted the same idea, giving it the notional name of The White Lion Society (the supporters of the College of Arms being two white lions, taken from the Earl Marshal's Mowbray supporters). Norroy and Ulster put the idea before the Chapter of the College and received its approval. The Society held its first meeting in May 1986.

## AIMS OF THE SOCIETY

The Society raises funds for the purchase of items or services of historical or heraldic importance to the College of Arms. Memorial Boards, placed in the Church of St. Benet Paul's Wharf (the *Heralds' Church*, where many heralds are buried or commemorated) have been provided, heraldic books purchased, ancient letters patent bought and framed, armorial glasses provided for receptions and photographs of old grants not in the College's archive bought.

## THE BADGE OF THE WHITE LION SOCIETY

The Badge used by the White Lion Society belongs to the Corporation of Her Majesty's Kings, Heralds and Pursuivants of Arms, and is used with their kind permission. The Blazon of the Badge is as follows:

*Standing erect upon a grassy Mound Or a Lion guardant Argent gorged with a Ducal Coronet Or and supporting with the forepaw a Spear Gold beaded Argent flowing therefrom to the sinister a Banner of the Corporation of Her Majesty's Kings Heralds and Pursuivants of Arms*
